ounting an outdoor production at the beginning of April, in a zoo that is located on a steep hill, in Scotland, does not come without a challenge or two. But when the possibility arrived of a family-orientated, promenade production at the RZSS Edinburgh Zoo, the idea became irresistible.



Commissioning Morna Pearson to write the script gave us a zany concoction of characters and when The Royal Lyceum Theatre Edinburgh and Edinburgh International Science Festival came onboard, the project began to feel very exciting.

A promenade production like this requires instant magic from the production team to set up and take down the changes that have to be made to the venues, sometimes while the performance is still on. To get sound, light, set and costumes to fit outdoors is more complicated than in a theatre, where the environment is controlled. A lot depends on the audience, how quickly you move and your timing! We have managed to get the best possible team together. Their work helps ensure the story is smooth and believable. The magic of theatre.

For the actors, performing outside requires different voice quality, acting techniques and layers upon layers of clothes to keep warm. For Lung Ha Theatre Company's actors this is the first time the company is producing a big outdoors production and their first show for a family audience - but with Grid Iron's experience we knew we could make it happen. The ties between both companies were forged through the successful cooperation on Huxley's Lab in 2010: here lies the beauty of co-producing work.

Our adventures have taken us to extraordinary places; from a massive shed in the Port of Dundee to a boat-builders island in a Norwegian fjord, to the former General Security building in Beirut, a working cancer hospital in Jordan, the old City Morgue in Cork, the largest climbing arena in Europe and parks, housing estates, playing fields and bars (for performances as well as recreation!) around Scotland and Britain.

We have made co-productions with many partners including the National Theatre of Scotland, the Traverse Theatre, Dundee Rep Theatre, The Almeida Theatre, London and Lung Has Theatre Company and we have delivered two European Capital of Culture Commissions (Cork 2005 and Stavanger 2008). We have performed thirteen times at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe and twice at Edinburgh International Festival. We've also been part of both Edinburgh International Science Festival and Imaginate, Edinburgh's international festival of performing arts for children and young people. In 2014, we were delighted to become the first theatre company to work in co-production with Edinburgh International Book Festival on *Letters Home*, which was supported by the Scottish Government's Edinburgh Festivals Expo Fund and was also part of Culture 2014, Glasgow's cultural celebration of the Commonwealth Games.

We are delighted to be working with Lung Ha Theatre Company again and to be in partnership with RZSS Edinburgh Zoo, Royal Lyceum Theatre Edinburgh and to be part of Edinburgh International Science Festival for a second time.
